DAY 1: SUNDAY, MARCH 23 (D)

WILLIAMSBURG

Today we set out for a journey steeped in history, patriotism, and beauty, beginning in the charming colonial streets of Williamsburg. After checking into our hotel for a two-night stay, we will gather for a delicious welcome dinner.

DAY 2: MONDAY, MARCH 24 (B, D)

WILLIAMSBURG

Step into the past with a visit to Colonial Williamsburg, where history comes to life in the meticulously restored buildings and immersive living history experiences. Wander cobblestone streets lined with historic homes, interact with costumed interpreters portraying colonial characters, and gain insight into daily life during America's formative years. From trades demonstrations to cultural performances, every corner reveals a new facet of 18th century colonial life. The Governor's Palace in Colonial Williamsburg is an elegant historic residence originally built in 1722, serving as the home of Virginia's colonial governors. Featuring grand architecture and lush formal gardens, the palace showcases the opulence and authority of the colonial government, providing visitors with a glimpse into 18th-century aristocratic life. Take a stroll through Merchant's Square, an enchanting 18th-century retail village brimming with charming shops, galleries, and eateries. We will arrive back at the hotel, and you will be given some time to freshen up before a group dinner.

DAY 3: TUESDAY, MARCH 25 (B, L, D)

WASHINGTON, D.C.


Enjoy breakfast at the hotel before we make our way to Mount Vernon. The plantation home of George Washington is located on the bank of the Potomac River in Virginia. This historic estate, now a museum, offers insight into the life of the first U.S. president through home tours and exhibits, discovering his remarkable leadership during challenging times. We will arrive in Washington, D.C. and begin exploring with a tram tour through Arlington National Cemetery, which provides a poignant and informative journey through one of America's most hallowed grounds. You can pay your respects at notable sites such as the Tomb of the Unknown Soldier and the graves of President John F. Kennedy and other prominent figures while learning about the cemetery's rich history and significance. We will end the day with dinner as a group at a local restaurant.

DAY 4: WEDNESDAY, MARCH 26 (B, L, D)

WASHINGTON, D.C.

Join a hop on/hop off tour of the memorials and monuments that honor the visionaries, revolutionaries, patriots, and heroes who shaped our nation. We will visit the Washington Monument, the Thomas Jefferson Memorial, the Lincoln Memorial, and the FDR Memorial. As you walk past the National World War II Memorial, the Korean War Veterans Memorial, and the Vietnam Veterans Memorial, you will have a solemn opportunity to remember those who have fought to keep our nation free. A Cherry Blossom Lunch Cruise on the Potomac River offers a unique and picturesque dining experience, combining gourmet cuisine with breathtaking views of Washington, D.C.'s iconic cherry blossoms in full bloom. As you glide along the river, you will enjoy the stunning pink and white blossoms lining the waterfront, creating an unforgettable backdrop for a delightful afternoon. You will have the remainder of the day to enjoy the variety of Smithsonian Museums that DC has to offer. These museums form the world's largest museum, education, and research





complex, and include the National Museum of American History, the National Air and Space Museum, the National Museum of Natural History, among many others. After an eventful day of sightseeing, we will have a group dinner before retiring for the evening.

DAY 5: THURSDAY, MARCH 27 (B, D)

WASHINGTON, D.C.

Depart on another day of sightseeing! Our guide will lead us past the White House, the Bureau of Printing and Engraving, the Library of Congress, and the National Archives. We will see the buildings where our representatives and senators convene and learn about our nation's diplomatic missions as we drive along Embassy Row. Visit the iconic seat of the United States Congress at the U.S. Capitol Building, symbolizing the country's democratic governance. Renowned for its majestic dome and neoclassical architecture, the Capitol building invites you to explore the Crypt, the Rotunda, and National Statuary Hall. Have a glimpse into one of the nation's premier cultural institutions at the Kennedy Center. Your guide will offer you an overview of the dramatic and historic performance venues of the original Kennedy Center building, with a stop at the new Arts and Ideals, the President John F. Kennedy exhibition space in the JFK Gallery, and the creative, state-of-the-art space of the REACH, a 4.6 acre park with three pavilions of rehearsal studios and classrooms. Tonight, we will gather for a farewell dinner to share stories of our favorite memories of this trip.

DAY 6: FRIDAY, MARCH 28 (B)

Today we say goodbye to Washington, D.C., taking wonderful memories of our trip with us.
